**A Friendly Reminder...**

Dear Families,

Somehow fall is upon us. How time flies! The past month we learned about fall, pumpkins, and community helpers. Each day we continue to learn how to form letters, numbers, write our name correctly and learn new songs.

There are many things to learn in Pre-K, the first is independence. At four, children are capable of completing many tasks and enjoy a sense of independence and responsibility, including: unpacking and repacking their own lunch boxes, knowing where their jacket/sweater/water bottle, taking care of all their toileting needs, putting on socks, shoes, and jackets to new a few.

Another component of this class is friendship building. As children become four year olds, their play and friendships change and deepen. They begin to learn how to negotiate and cooperate; converse in appropriate ways, take turns/wait for a turn, listen, and share friends and toys. This is difficult for children at this age, friendships break down and children are unkind (to each other) and say, "You're not my friend! I don't want to play with you." When this happens we have a quick meeting and discuss how each child is feeling and how better to be kind and loving.

Lastly, as children become more aware of their world around them they often begin to push the boundaries and stop listening to adults/parents around them. This is a normal development (even though challenging at times). Staying firm and adjusting or increasing consequences will help the child feel safe and secure as they grow in appropriate ways.

Thank you for the beautiful pumpkins. We had a wonderful time carving, looking at the seeds and learning about pumpkins.
